Have it approved by your teacher no later than:  (Every student in class needs to read a different book and will be approved on first come first serve basis.  3. Step 2: Create a book Jacket for the book you read. Use the paper provided to create a new front and back cover of your report book. Use the following information to help you with your project.
Front Cover:  Design a cover for your book that includes:  Title of the book (in color)  Author of the book (in color)  Your name (in color)  A creative illustration: should be a hand-drawn picture that portrays a  "feeling" for the book
Spine:  ✓ Use creative lettering to design a spine for your book jacket  ✓ Include the title of the book and the author's name  ✓ Color or continue illustration
Back Cover:  ✓ Write 4-5 sentence summary of the book to get the reader excited about checking out your book. Make sure to leave the reader wanting more.  ✓ Color or continue illustration

- Describe the main characters (what they look like, their personality, likes/ dislikes). If there is more than one main character be sure to write about each of them.

#### **Plot Descriptions**

### Paragraph 2

 Describe what happened in the BEGINNING of the book with several detailed sentences. What problems did the characters face?

#### Paragraph 3

 Describe what happened in the MIDDLE of the book with several detailed sentences. How will the characters' solve their problems?

### Paragraph 4

O Describe what happened in the END of the book with several detailed sentences. Did the characters problems get resolved? How did the characters feel at the end of the story?

- o Describe what you liked about the book.
- Describe what you disliked about the book.
